
COMMUNITY

Savanna High School was established in 1961 and is one of eight comprehensive high schools in the Anaheim Union High School District. Savanna High School is located in Anaheim, California and serves West Anaheim, parts of Buena Park, and some unincorporated areas of Orange County.

STAFF

The school leadership team is composed of a principal, three assistant principals, and five counselors. SHS has 81 teachers and 24 support staff. The following staff members provide additional support:

- a full-time and a part-time Psychologist
- two full-time Speech Pathologists
- a full-time Family And Community Engagement Specialist
- a full-time Interpreter/Translator (Sp<mark>ani</mark>sh)
- a part-time Modified/Adaptive Physical Education Teacher
- a full-time Social Worker
- a full-time College and Career Readiness Specialist



SCHOOL

Savanna High School receives supplemental funding from Title I and Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)
Concentration. Since 80% of our student population is low income by the federal definition, Title I funding is used to provide academic support for low performing students, additional teachers and paraprofessionals that focus on mathematics and English language arts support, and supplemental instructional material to make content and instruction accessible. LCFF funds provide additional support to meet the goals outlined in the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), particularly focusing on English Learners, low-income students, and foster youth. This focus on every student has allowed Savanna to receive the following honors and recognition:
